Scout Law

- 1. A Scout is to be trusted.
- 2. A Scout is loyal.
- 3. A Scout is friendly and considerate.
- 4. A Scout belongs to the worldwide family of Scouts.
- 5. A Scout has courage in all difficulties
- 6. A Scout makes good use of time and is careful of possessions and property.
- 7. A Scout has self-respect and respect for others

Scout Values:

Integrity: We act with integrity; we are honest, trustworthy and loyal.

Respect: We have self-respect and respect for others.

Care: We support others and take care of the world in which we live.

Belief: We explore our faiths, beliefs and attitudes.

Cooperation: We make a positive difference; we co-operate with others and make

friends.

Consequences

If Scouts are not keeping their Scout Promise, Law or following Scout Values they will be given a warning.

- Warning One Stop and think about your behaviour.
- Warning Two Take a time out and think about your behaviour.
- Warning Three Leaders will speak with Scout and parents.

More than three warnings – If you receive more than three warnings in one night or you continue to receive warnings each week, you will be asked to miss a Scout meeting and we will speak about how you plan to improve your behaviour.

Dangerous or threatening behaviour – If a Scout instigates dangerous or threatening behaviour towards themselves or others, they will automatically receive three warnings, parents will be spoken with and they will be asked to miss a Scout meeting. Any further incidents will be escalated to our Group Scout Leader.
